WHEREAS: This City of Brooklyn Center has been recognized as a 1986 All-America City and remains a proud city in a proud state; and

WHEREAS: This community has emphasized growth, family values, and industry as it has seen and adapted to the many changes that come with a progressive city and a part of a global citizenship; and

WHEREAS: A strong sense of family, hard work and patriotism is at the heart of the origin of Brooklyn Center and to that end affords residents opportunities to live, shop and work in a safe and growing community; and

WHEREAS: Brooklyn Center has embraced a community of residents who are as diverse as the world and are committed to making their community successful and representatives of the world; and

WHEREAS: It is appropriate to recognize Brooklyn Center as a place where families and businesses can come, work and stay.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, MARK DAYTON, Governor of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim February 5, 2011 as:
